SESSION 6 | WORK

A Crisis of Work in Our Culture

The crisis of work in our culture is a spiritual problem. As God is rejected and removed from a society, work becomes a meaningless pursuit. God is the creator of work. Work is to be done for HIS glory. Disconnected from God and His glory, work devolves into self-centered pursuits of money, prestige, and power. Or, toward self protecting laziness.

God is The Worker (Genesis 1)

The Bible begins with a work week in which God models for us six days of work and one day of rest. We see progress each day as God works to develop, build, and cultivate creation.

God Created Man to Work (Genesis 2)

“The LORD God took the man & put him in the garden of Eden to **work** it and **keep** it.”

- Genesis 2:15

Created in the image of God, we reflect God as a worker. Essential to the image of God is the task to take dominion, which includes work. When work is rejected, men are rendered useless and chaos ensues. Without work, men are vulnerable to depression and there will be dissonance in the home.

Important Truth: God created man for work before the fall. Work was, and is, good.

- The curse makes work hard but work is not a curse.

Genesis 3:17-19

¹⁷ And to Adam he said, “Because you have listened to the voice of your wife and have eaten of the tree of which I commanded you, ‘You shall not eat of it,’ cursed is the ground because of you; in pain you shall eat of it all the days of your life; ¹⁸ thorns and thistles it shall bring forth for you; and you shall eat the plants of the field. ¹⁹ By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread, till you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; for you are dust, and to dust you shall return.”

Laziness is Condemned by God

“The desire of the sluggard kills him, for his hands refuse to labor.”

- Proverbs 21:25

“How long will you lie there, O sluggard? When will you arise from your sleep? A little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to rest, and poverty will come upon you like a robber, and want like an armed man.”

- Proverbs 6:9-11

“The sluggard says, ‘There is a lion in the road! There is a lion in the streets!’ As a door turns on its hinges, so does a sluggard on his bed. The sluggard buries his hand in the dish; it wears him out to bring it back to his mouth. The sluggard is wiser in his own eyes than seven men who can answer sensibly.”

If anyone is not willing to work, let him not eat. For we hear that some among you walk in idleness, not busy at work, but busybodies. Now such persons we command and encourage in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living.

²³ Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, ²⁴ knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ. ²⁵ For the wrongdoer will be paid back for the wrong he has done, and there is no partiality.

“...Lord Christ...” - Master, King; integrity, weighed & judged by the Lord

“...as for the Lord not men...”

“...wrongdoer...” - Master who abuses authority; slave who steals from master

Plan to Redeem Your Work

Make work worship as you see Jesus' glory in all of creation.

“There is not one square inch of the entire creation about which Jesus Christ does not cry out, ‘This is mine. It belongs to me.’” – Abraham Kuyper

See work as dominion as you seek to bring Jesus' order to chaos in the world.

Embrace your work as an opportunity to sacrificially serve others.

“But if anyone does not provide for his relatives, and especially for members of his household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever.”

- 1 Timothy 5:8

Be a witness *in, through, and at* work.

Work to rest, rest to work.

Work for the Great Commission.

Principles Teach Kids to Work

- Dad's attitude about work becomes your kid's attitude about work.
- Give your kids work responsibility in and around the home early and often.
- Expect your kids to contribute to the families agenda and mission. Do not allow them to be distinct bystanders or passive recipients.
- Expect them to provide for much of their personal privileges that go above and beyond necessities.
- Give them things they can accomplish easily. But also give them things they cannot do without struggle, grit and perseverance.
- Teach them that the goal at the heart of sports, music, art, and even education is to develop a solid work ethic that honors God.
