Marriage...

...a sacrificial, unconditional, one-flesh witness of the gospel

Marriage as Covenant

Marriage is a Holy Covenant before God between one man and one woman, whereby one man and one woman commit before God to become one in every way. You promised to become one in every way: physically, spiritually, and legally.

Marriage and The Gospel

The one-flesh covenant relationship of marriage proclaims the gospel as the man and woman embrace their distinct roles of 'husband' and 'wife.' The husband displays Jesus' love through a self-giving, unconditional commitment to his bride. The wife displays the Church's trust in Jesus as she intentionally places herself under her husband's leadership and provision.

Marriage and the Church

For our church to be healthy, our marriages must be healthy. Marriage is to be a picture of the gospel. Each marriage in our church is meant to witness the gospel. A church who has a low view of marriage essentially has a low view of the gospel.

Marriage and Men

Sacrificial Love

Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her...

– Ephesians 5:25

The limitless, self-giving love of the cross defines a husband's love for his wife.

- Sacrificial love is meant to be hard
- The warfare is in the inconvenience

Single Men: How do I prepare myself for marriage?

Embrace inconvenience.

Unconditional Love

²⁶ that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word ²⁷ so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish.

- Ephesians 5:26-27

God made an **unconditional promise** to Jesus' sinful bride to make her pure by meeting all the conditions on her behalf. He has sealed this promise in blood at the cross.

Conditions Change, but Love Doesn't

Single Men: Embrace the responsibility of unconditional commitments

One-Flesh Commitment

²⁸ In the same way husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. ²⁹ For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the church, ³⁰ because we are members of his body.

- Ephesians 5:28-30

You are not bound to anyone or anything before the Holy God of the universe, the way you are bound to your wife.

Love Her with the Gospel

The greatest way to love your wife as yourself is by committing to make sure she is experiencing the love of God in Christ found in the gospel.

- Does she know the gospel?
- Does she feel the gospel?

• Does she hear the gospel?

³¹ "Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." ³² This mystery is profound, and I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church. ³³ However, let each one of you love his wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband.

- Ephesians 5:31-33

Unconditional Love

What will you say to your wife and do for your wife to turn from the sin of loving her conditionally and embrace the unconditional love of the gospel?

One Flesh Love

Ask your wife the following questions so that you may in turn encourage her with God's love for her in Christ.

- Do you believe God loves you unconditionally?
- Do you genuinely believe God has forgiven you for your sins?
- What things do you do believing God is more happy with you when you do them than when you don't?
- Are there areas in which you feel like you are failing God?

Take some time and pray with your wife, specifically encouraging her with gospel truths (God's love, forgiveness, and acceptance based on Jesus and His work for her).

One of the ways your wife will feel or experience the gospel is by initiating reconciliation. Is there a lingering conflict you need to address? Should you be asking for or granting forgiveness? What step will you take today to initiate reconciliation with your wife?
